

Topic: Changes to the Public Records Act

In 2014, the Court of Appeals in *City of San Jose v. Superior Court of Santa Clara County* determined that emails and other written materials sent on employees' personal accounts were not subject to disclosure under the Public Records Act ("PRA"). The case was appealed to the California Supreme Court. The Supreme Court finally issued its decision last week, reversing the Court of Appeals and holding that <u>all non-exempt records</u>, deemed responsive to the PRA request and located on employees' personal devices, must be disclosed.

The Supreme Court's decision has substantial implications for all government employers, including school districts. However, when a PRA request is received, public agencies should now notify all employees who may have responsive records on their personal devices, and require that such records be produced. Those employees should also be required to submit a sworn declaration indicating that all responsive records have been provided.

Even when records are held on an employee's personal device, government employers are not obligated to release records that are "exempt" from disclosure under the PRA's many potential exemptions. Before disclosing requested records, agencies should allow their legal counsel to review the request to determine what, if any exemptions apply.

Kingsley Bogard is in the process of analyzing the decision to determine what, if any, additional policy changes must be implemented as a result of the Supreme Court's ruling. In the meantime, please feel free to contact us with any questions.

I measured the slab over the weekend. The big slab is 99.5' X 24.17(2'') for a total of 2,670 square feet. This would take approximately 34 yards of concrete at about \$100 a yard.

\$3,400 in concrete.

\$1,000 for concrete finishers.

\$1,000 for misc. (Rebar, rock fill,,etc)

\$5,400

I think you could tell the board \$6,000 at most.

FYI - If Byerly Concrete bid this job I would probably charge \$5\$ (The going rate is \$6.) a square foot. Which would be \$13,350. I recall some other GCOE projects that the winning bid was \$8\$. (Maybe \$8.50) a square foot. Which would be \$21,360. Just to put it into perspective.

The other slab is only 2 yards of concrete. Just a couple hundred dollars that I would save for later and just do by myself.
