SUBJECT: Public Water System No. 1100448 – Compliance with Citation 21-20C-014

As you know, Citation No. 21-20C-014 (Citation) for noncompliance with Sections 64675 and 67690 of Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR) was issued to Plaza Elementary School (school) on July 31, 2020 for not performing the required follow-up monitoring after a lead action level exceedance that occurred in 2003.

The Citation directed the school to, in part:

- 1. Comply with Section 64675.5, Title 22, of the CCR in all future monitoring periods.
- 2. Conduct standard monitoring (10 samples) for lead and copper every six (6) months. Samples shall be collected from specified taps for two (2) consecutive periods: July 1 through December 31, 2020 and January 1 through June 30, 2021.
- 3. Collect samples in accordance with the Lead and Copper Rule per Title 22, Section 64677.
- 4. Provide public notification (by inclusion in the 2020 Consumer Confidence Report) of the failure to collect follow-up lead and copper, due to the 2003 ALE, as required by the Lead and Copper regulations.

The Division has determined that the school has substantially complied with Directive 2 of the Citation by conducting sampling in June and December 2020 instead of second half of 2020 and first half of 2021. Due to the low test result values from these two sets of samples, as outlined in the Citation, the school may proceed directly to triennial monitoring with the next set of five (5) samples, due between June and September 2023. The Division will therefore not undertake further enforcement of Directive 2.

The school should continue to comply with Directives 1, 3 and 4. As a reminder, Directive 4 requires the school regulation to include language regarding receipt of the Citation in the 2020 Consumer Confidence Report. If you wish to deviate from the following language, please contact Terri Parham:

"The school received a citation from the state's Division of Drinking Water for not performing adequate lead and copper sampling in the mid and late 2000's"

It is requested that the school provide a list of the lead and copper sampling sites at least 30 days prior to the June through September 2023 sampling event for review.

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress

Last year state mandated Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) for 3rd-8th grade were cancelled due to school closures. This year the state will require them, even for districts who are distance learning. From my understanding they will be shorter in length from previous years. 3rd-8th grades will begin preparing for testing by taking interim block assessments, which is a useful tool to use to determine what English Language Arts and Math standards students lack proficiency. The data we get also helps us plan and improve instruction.

In the 2018-19 school year Plaza staff and I pushed hard for students to try their best on SBA. It is important for us to know where students are academically, and it tells the public how well we are teaching Plaza students. Students' hard work that year really paid off because our school scores increased significantly and really separated us from the rest of the schools in Glenn and the surrounding counties. It is the reason we were recognized as a California Distinguished School last year.

To help limit disruptions to the testing schedule, please make every attempt to have your child here during those testing periods by scheduling appointments, vacations, or any other activity before or after the testing dates. Most assessments are scheduled during the morning, but some students take more than one period to complete. Although a schedule when each grade will test will be published soon, we usually begin the last week of April and end the second week of May. Like everything else, it may be a little different this year.

Purpose

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes a formal working relationship between Capay Joint Union School District, Plaza Elementary School and Glenn County Office of Education (GCOE) acting as partners in the SPARK/After School Education and Safety (ASES) Supplemental Summer program. The goals and objectives of our collaboration are to expand learning opportunities for students, families, and community members; to provide academic, enrichment, mentoring, and tutoring educational support; to develop cultural and linguistic competence; to offer opportunities for summer recreation; to provide center-based and linked health, social, and safety services; to provide technology and career training to students and adults; and to expand school and community participation in drug-free, supervised, and fun activities to be provided in a safe and supervised learning environment.

Description of Services

Capay Joint Union School District will support the Plaza Elementary Supplemental Summer Program by providing the following services:

- Coordinate promotion, recruitment, and enrollment of Capay Elementary students in the program
- Provide all necessary student data and enrollment documentation as required from the ASES grant and Plaza Elementary
- Coordinate transportation to and from Capay Elementary (if applicable)

Plaza Elementary will support the SPARK/ASES Supplemental Summer Program by providing the following services to Plaza Elementary School Students and Capay Elementary students:

- Provide instruction, administration, staffing (training and management), curriculum, recreation, and support that meet the guidelines and requirements set forth by the ASES supplemental program grant to up to 20-24 students from Capay Elementary School System grades K-8 from June 21, 2021 to July 30, 2021 at Plaza Elementary School.
- Students will be served breakfast, lunch, and a healthy snack at the site
- Provide use of facilities, utilities, and janitorial services.
- Provide attendance tracking and data for Capay Elementary and Plaza Elementary students (separately) to Glenn County Office of Education
- Provide Summer budgeting and fiscal reports to Glenn County Office of Education
