

Bike-a-Thon:

On Friday, September 9th all Plaza students will participate in a bike-a-thon to help raise money for the 6th/7th grade environmental camp. Next year, Mr. Lovell and Mrs. Cinquini will be taking their classes to Pacific Environmental Education Center (PEEC) at MacKerricher State Park in Ft. Bragg. PEEC is a non-profit, standards-based, residential outdoor science school where students will visit the beach, tide pools, seal rookery, coastal prairie, fresh water lake and whale skeletons. They will also have opportunities to explore unique sand dunes, and hike through the redwood and pygmy forests on the wave-cut terraces of the Jughandle Ecological Staircase Trail.

Student Drop Off, Pick Up, and Parking:







It was brought to my attention that a complaint was made to CHP about the morning drop off on Road 24 and, as many of you saw last week, they dispatched an officer to patrol the road. The CHP officer informed that even though it is not against the law to park and cross Road 24, it is extremely dangerous due to the amount of traffic driving by, most of which are going above the speed limit for a school zone. Before and after school, please drop off and pick up students in the main parking lot off of Road S. Please do not park in the spaces on Road 24 because they are reserved for staff.

Additionally, please do not park for more than 5 minutes in the lanes painted green in the main parking lot from 2:45-3pm. It is important to keep vehicles flowing in those lanes so traffic doesn't back up on Road S. If your child does not arrive at the crosswalk within 5 minutes, drive around and either pull into one of the lanes again or find a place to park in the lot. If you choose to park on Road S or 24, your child will be dismissed from the crosswalk area once I see an adult to escort them to their vehicle. One way you can help alleviate congestion, if your schedule allows, is to arrive for pick up after 2:55pm since most vehicles are gone by this time.
